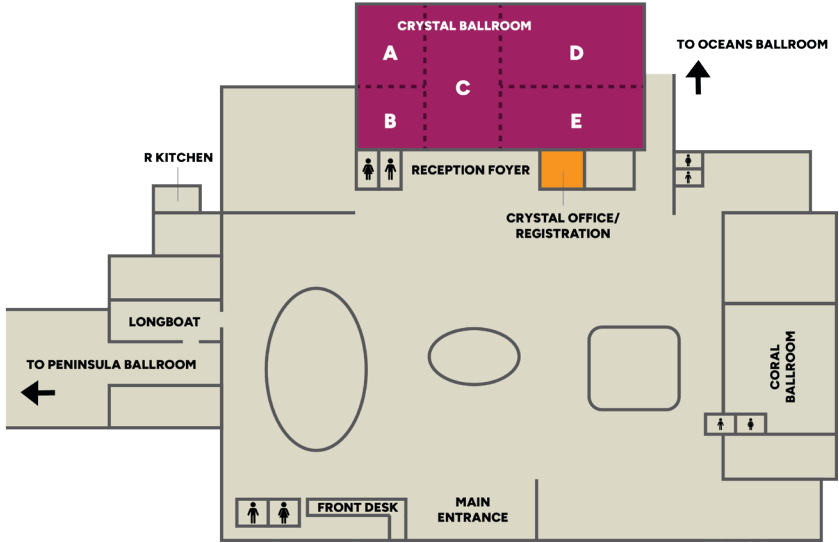

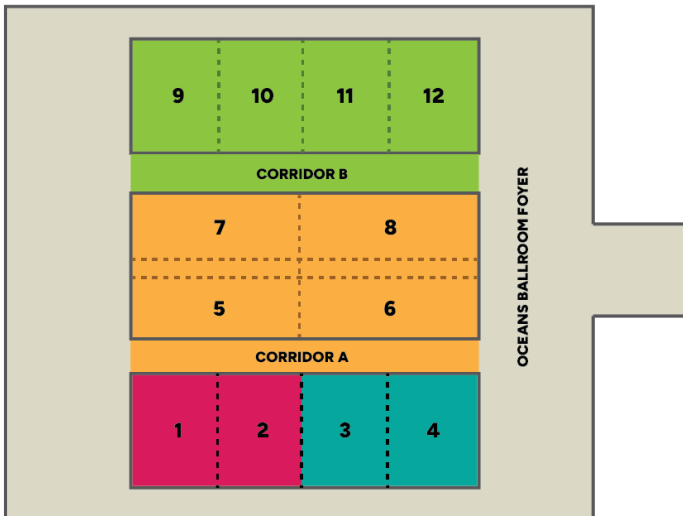


MEETING MAP

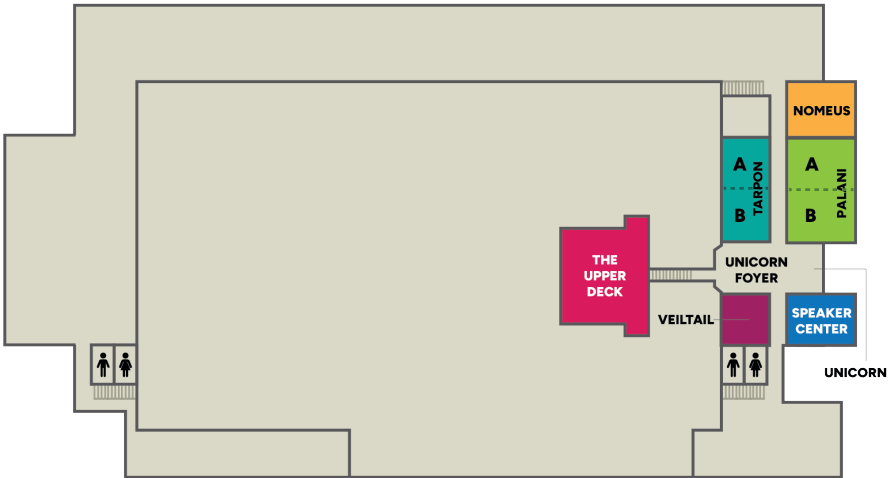
FIRST FLOOR

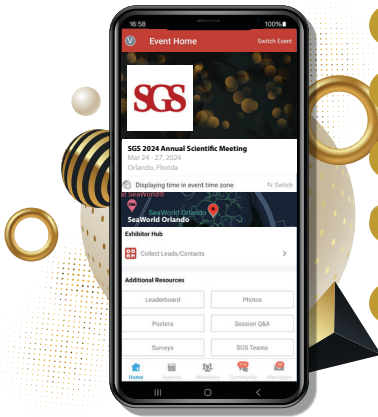

Linda D. Bradley, MD, is Professor of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Biology, Director of the Center for Hysteroscopic Services and Menstrual

Disorders, and Director of Hysteroscopic Education for the Residency Program at the Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine. She was recently appointed Vice Chair for Diversity and Inclusion for the Cleveland Clinic Women's Health Institute. She is an internationally recognized gynecologic surgeon known for her expertise in office-based diagnostic and operative hysteroscopy, hysteroscopic treatment of retained products of conception, hysteroscopic myomectomy, hysteroscopic polypectomy, evaluation, management and medical treatment of abnormal uterine bleeding in women with anemia of chronic disease, consultation and second opinions for alternatives to hysterectomy, hysteroscopic removal of retained foreign bodies and providing patient-centered care. She established and maintains a robust collaborative practice with interventional radiologists for referrals for uterine artery embolization at the Cleveland Clinic. Additional academic interests include assessment of peri-menopausal and menopausal issues, mentoring and sponsoring students, residents, and fellows.

In addition to serving in many national and international leadership positions, Dr. Bradley has been a servant leader at the Cleveland Clinic and her city. Since its inception, she has been a member the Women's Professional Staff Association at the Cleveland Clinic, and serves on a departmental committee on burnout. Her team is engaged and discovering novel methods to create a culture of well-being, efficiency of practice and personal resilience.

Dr. Bradley has published numerous journal articles, book chapters, and continuing medical education films and has performed several live telesurgical procedures for national and international meetings. She is a co-author of her own pioneering textbook: *Hysteroscopy: Office Evaluation and Management of the Uterine Cavity*, and authored a chapter on hysteroscopic myomectomy in *Te Linde's Operative Gynecology* in 2019 and 2023.

Dr. Bradley earned a bachelor's degree in Biopsychology from Vassar College before attending the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine, where she received her Doctor of Medicine (MD) degree. She completed her residency training at Case Western Reserve University and Cleveland Metropolitan General Hospital in Cleveland, Ohio. She has completed an executive program in practice management from the Weatherhead School of Business, Case Western Reserve, and has completed the Leadership in Healthcare Academy at the Cleveland Clinic.

Maureen G. Phipps, MD, MPH is a physician executive with significant experience in academic medicine, research, non-profit, and advocacy leadership. Dr. Phipps uses strategic leadership and vision to help organizations and individuals achieve their goals.

Dr. Phipps is Professor Emerita of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University where she served as chair of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, assistant

dean for Teaching and Research in Women's Health, and executive chief of women's health for the Care New England Health System. During her 20-year tenure at Brown, Women & Infants Hospital, and in Rhode Island, Dr. Phipps led numerous research, education, policy, and program initiatives including directing the NIH-funded Women Reproductive Health Research Scholars Program, developing curriculum, advancing strategic programs, leading the Rhode Island Task Force on Premature Birth, and directing the Brown and Women & Infants Hospital National Center of Excellence in Women's Health. Her research and academic leadership advanced collaborations across departments, hospitals, and state agencies. Dr. Phipps was the principal investigator or co-investigator for multiple projects and programs funded through the National Institutes of Health and other agencies. Dr. Phipps' dedication to and positive impact on developing the next generation of leaders in medicine and women's health has been recognized with teaching and mentoring awards.

As the CEO of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (2019-2023), Dr. Phipps successfully led ACOG through unprecedented challenges globally and nationally. STRIKING THE BALANCE BETWEEN HUMAN VS MACHINE: ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS IN THE INTEGRATION OF AI INTO GYNECOLOGIC SPECIALTIES AND SUBSPECIALTIES

Artificial intelligence (AI) promises to advance the practice of medicine by improving outcomes and clinical efficiencies, yet this reality needs to be achieved with clear ethical and practical guardrails in place. This presentation will summarize the leading ethical issues associated with the use of AI in healthcare. We will briefly define key concepts of AI and then critically evaluate the key ethical issues to consider when integrating this technology into clinical practice. We will emphasize the implications of this technology for gynecologic surgeons, focusing on the ethics of transparency to patients, safety, surgeon burden and burnout, and moral distress. Additionally, the primary implications of AI in patient education, surgical planning and management, and medical education will be highlighted. Importantly, we will propose ethically supported recommendations for gynecologic surgeons to consider as AI is increasingly integrated into the care of patients. We will foster a meaningful dialogue to ensure that this presentation is relevant and dynamic and contributes to the active engagement of the SGS membership in the development of AI-based technologies.

Dr. Ruth Farrell is an academic specialist in OB/GYN at the Cleveland Clinic who is dedicated to providing patients with the highest-quality, evidence-based, and innovative healthcare. She is a board-certified OB/GYN with a primary appointment in the OB/GYN Institute and secondary appointments in the Center for Bioethics and Genomic Medicine Institute and Professor of OB/GYN and Reproductive Biology at Case Western Reserve University. Dr. Farrell is the Vice Chair of Research at the Cleveland Clinic OB/GYN Institute, where she leads their research strategy and academic performance across a

spectrum of basic, translational, clinical, and health services research. Her NIH-funded line of research focuses on the clinical, ethical, social, and legal/policy implications of new biomedical science and technology in reproductive medicine, focusing on outcomes, shared decision-making, and decision analysis. She received her MA in Bioethics and MD from Case Western Reserve University.

Following residency, she completed the Greenwall Fellowship in Bioethics and Health Policy, a joint program hosted by Johns Hopkins and Georgetown Universities. During this time, she also served as the J. Benjamin Younger Fellow of Policy at ASRM in Washington, DC. From 2022 to 2023, she was a Hedwig van Ameringen Executive Leadership in Academic Medicine (ELAM) Fellow, with continued efforts to support the career development of academic physicians.



Susannah Rose

Dr. Susannah Rose is a Core Faculty member in the Center for Biomedical Ethics and Society and is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Biomedical Informatics at Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC). Prior to VUMC, she was a Full Professional Staff (faculty) member at Cleveland Clinic, and she served in many leadership roles, including as the Director of Research for the Center of Bioethics, the Director of Research for Safety, Quality, and Patient Experience, Associate Chief Experience Officer, and Director of the Program in AI + Ethics. Dr. Rose is also an Instructor at Harvard University's T.H. Chan School of Public Health.

Dr. Rose earned her PhD from Harvard University's Health Policy Program (with a concentration in Ethics), an MS in Bioethics from Union College/Albany Medical Center, and an MS in Social Work from Columbia University. Her publications have appeared in high-ranked peer-reviewed journals, such as JAMA Internal Medicine, The Journal of Clinical Oncology (JCO), The New England Journal of Medicine (NEJM), American Journal of Bioethics (AJOB), and The Hastings Center Report.

Her current research focuses on the ethics and impact of medical technology innovations, including artificial intelligence in healthcare and developing data-driven approaches to improve patient care. Dr. Rose's research has been generously funded by multiple sources, including the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Harvard University's Edmond J. Safra Center for Ethics, and The Greenwall Foundation.

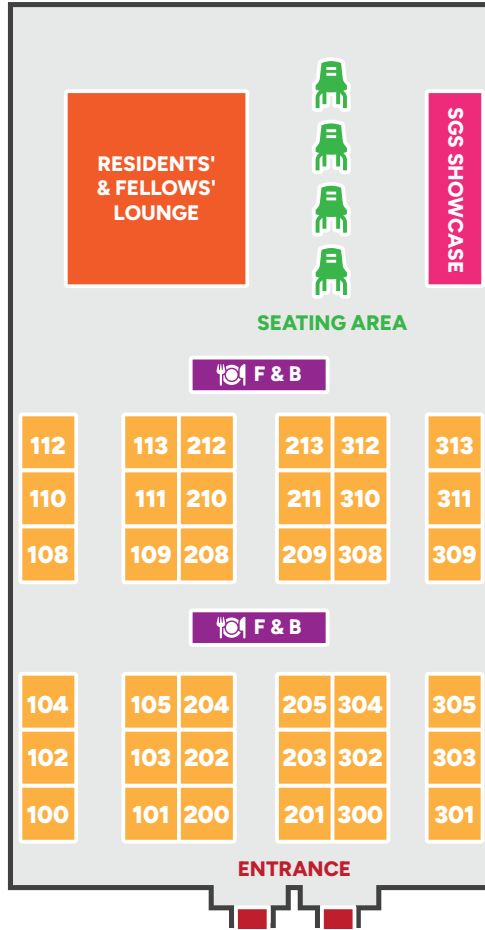

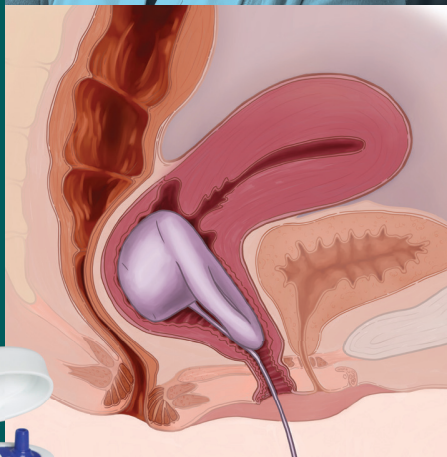
