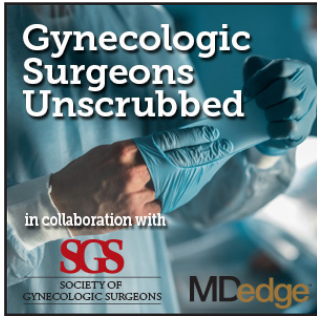

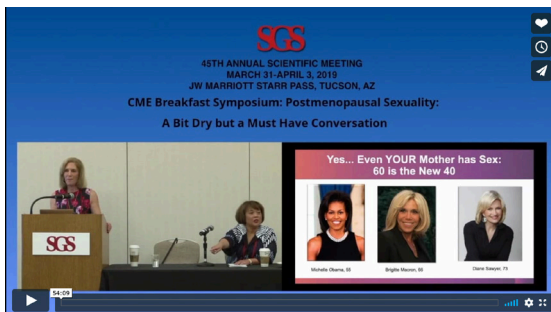
### CoRPS Announcement

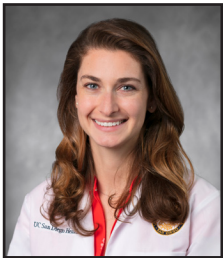

### Michael P. Aronson Award Winners

Dr. Michael P. Aronson was a Society of Gynecologic Surgeons Distinguished Surgeon, expert vaginal surgeon, and educator. He was extremely passionate about surgical education. In his honor, the Michael P. Aronson Fund was established in 2014 to continue excellence in postgraduate education in gynecologic surgery. The fund supports faculty members from resident education teaching institutions to help increase utilization of vaginal hysterectomy as the primary approach to hysterectomy. #### Sarah Kluck, MD



Sarah Kluck, MD, completed her OB/GYN residency at UC San Diego School of Medicine, where she served as an administrative chief. She earned her medical degree from Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, Missouri. She completed her undergraduate education at Yale University, where she received a B.S. in Biomedical Engineering.

She is currently working as assistant professor of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at the UC San Diego School of Medicine, where she trains medical students and residents. She has a special interest in minimally invasive gynecologic surgery and treating conditions such as abnormal bleeding, fibroids, polyps and abnormal pap smears.

She received the 2019 Resident Award by The Society for Academic Specialists in General Obstetrics and Gynecology. She is a member of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and served as Junior Fellow Vice Chair and Chair for the San Diego section during her residency.

#### Felicia L. Hamilton, MD



Dr. Hamilton is the Associate Program Director for the MedStar Washington Hospital Center residency program in OBGYN, chair of the OB/Gyn Practice Committee, Medical Director of mother-baby units and a practicing clinician at MedStar Washington Hospital Center in Washington DC. She attended medical school at the University of Arizona College of Medicine in Tucson, Arizona and completed her OB/GYN residency at St. Luke's Roosevelt in New York City. In the years since residency, Dr. Hamilton has been practicing and serving the women in the DC/MD/VA areas. Her current leadership roles have given her the opportunity to lead very dynamic teams and have significant interdisciplinary impact on the quality and safety of the patients that are served at MedStar Health. Her dedication to resident education is ongoing and extensive and she is committed to teaching residents excellent

surgical skills so they can become full scope practioners upon completion of residency. She is currently earning a Medical Education Research Certificate (MERC) and a certificate in Leadership Education and Development (LEAD) from the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC).
